BIOGRAPHY Jade Bentil is a Black Feminist Historian and PhD candidate in the Faculty of History at the University of Oxford. Her work maps the genealogies of Black women's world-making activism, both in Britain and throughout the Black diaspora. Her research combines the politics of Black feminism, prison industrial complex abolition, anti-imperialism and queer theorisations to approach the histories of Black women's autonomous organising in mid-late twentieth century Britain. For her work on Black women's activism in the twentieth century, she was awarded the 2017 Marion Sharples Prize.

Jade is currently working on her first book, *Rebel Citizen*, an oral history-based project focusing on the intimate recollections and experiences of Black women of African and Caribbean descent who migrated to Britain following the Second World War. *Rebel Citizen* will be published by Penguin Press in 2022.
